EACOP Launches Liaison Office in Hoima District

Following the Final Investment Decision (FID) that was taken on the 1st of February 2022, East African Crude Oil Pipeline (EACOP) Ltd on 15th February concluded the formation of the company that will construct the 1,443km long, East African Crude Oil Pipeline¹ from Kabaale, in Uganda's Hoima District to the Chongoleani Peninsula near Tanga Port in Tanzania.

The Company seeks to improve on its presence in the project areas by establishing liaison offices in the different locations along the pipeline route.

The establishment of the Liaison Office in Kijungu, Hoima City, today 12th August 2022, is therefore an important part of the Projects overall commitment to stakeholder engagement, consultation of the affected communities, and respect for their rights to information.

"We are currently implementing the land acquisition process for the main right of way in both Uganda and Tanzania, and the process has involved extensive engagement with all our stakeholders. The establishment of the liaison office in Hoima will go a long way in ensuring that our stakeholders in the districts of Hoima, and the surrounding districts of Kikuube, Kyankwanzi and Kakumiro have access to information, and a comprehensive understanding of Project activities." ¹ The East African Crude Oil Pipeline (EACOP) is a 1,443 km long crude oil export pipeline that will transport Uganda's oil from Kabaale- Hoima in Uganda to the Chongoleani Peninsula nea_r Tanga Port in Tanzania for export to the international market. This major export system, 296km in Uganda and 1,447KM in Tanzania), comprises of a 24 inch, insulated, heat traced and buried pipeline, six pumping stations(2 in Uganda and 4 in Tanzania), two pressure reduction stations and a Marine Storage Terminal.
